2022 Annual Report

Dear Friends,

Thanks to your help, 2022 has been a year of pivoting and adjusting to serve our patients through all the challenges presented by the continuing COVID-19 pandemic. The availability of the COVID-19 vaccine helped us increase our number of volunteers which has helped us increase hours and services to meet the needs of our community.

Here are some highlights of the year that you, our donors and volunteers, have made possible:

- Thanks to funding from the Community Foundation for Southeast Michigan Pontiac Capacity
 Building Grant, we completed our board development project instituting new bylaws, restructured committees, and a leadership succession plan.
 Funding to create a strategic plan in 2023 was also approved.
- We began preliminary steps to pursuing a Patient-Center Medical Home (PCMH) certification for the Clinic.
- All pre-COVID specialty services became available again.
- We began partnership with Oakland University
 William Beaumont student free clinic to expand
 our gynecology and dermatology programs to provide more health maintenance care in addition to
 urgent care.
- We received a 2-year \$100,000 grant from Impact 100 Oakland County to support a full-time Case Coordinator to help our patients navigate their healthcare needs, including connecting them to free diagnostic and surgical services to address serious and sometimes life-threatening conditions.
- We received a free membership to Dispensary of Hope from Ascension Providence Hospital that allows us to secure free medications including insulin for our patients.
- We held another successful Esteemed Women of Michigan event, raising \$100,000 in unrestricted support. EWM 2023 will be a "Stay-at-Home" event as we focus on creating our new strategic plan.

 Our COVID-19 vaccination project funded through Michigan Department of Health and Human Services continued to provide vaccination clinics at sites throughout Oakland County and every Friday at our Clinic, vaccinating more than 1,000 adults and children over the past 2 years.

We'd like to thank the special foundations who continue to support our dental program: The Vera and Joseph Dresner Foundation, the Delta Dental Foundation, and the Michigan Dental Association Foundation, Frank G. and Gertrude Dunlap Fund and others. And for their important support for the operations of the Clinic, we thank the Kathy White, the Peterson Family Foundation and the Doris and Norma Van Gorp Foundation.

We also thank donors like you for the vital contributions you make to providing quality healthcare to those without insurance. As Dr. Gary Burnstein once said, "the quality of a person's healthcare should not be determined by their ability to pay." Because of you, we continue to deliver on Dr. Burnstein's promise.





Glenda lost her insurance coverage a few years ago. As a result, Glenda could not afford to get her blood pressure medicines refilled, let alone care for other medical needs. Three years ago she visited a drop-in clinic and her blood pressure was so high,

they gave her a choice – the emergency room or the Gary Burnstein Clinic. "I feel I would have died if the Gary Burnstein Clinic hadn't helped me," Glenda says.

Jim was a truck driver for 25 years, but when the job became physically painful he had to go on disability. He applied for Medicaid but was told it may take up to 2 years before he was eligible. Then a friend told him about the Gary Burnstein



Clinic. While waiting for his Medicaid coverage he has received his vaccines, got new glasses, and can't wait to start his dental care. "It's getting hard to eat, I keep losing teeth," said Jim. He's overwhelmed with the care and friendliness he received from everyone at the Clinic. "I don't have insurance, but you didn't treat me bad, you all treated me with the utmost respect. I really like the kindness."
