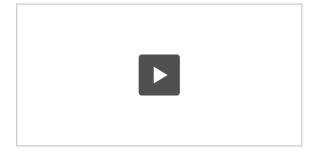

November has a number of health-related issues to be aware of this month:

#### **Diabetes Awareness Month**

According to the National Institute of Health (NIH), Diabetes "occurs when your blood glucose, also called blood sugar, is too high. It affects about 38 million Americans, including adults and youth" and is linked to a variety of health problems. To help prevent these health problems it is important to know your risk factors, which include being 35 or older, a family history of diabetes, prediabetes, being overweight, and a lack of physical activity. African Americans and other racial minorities are at higher risk. Testing for diabetes is available for GBCHC patients. If you have risk factors, discuss getting tested for diabetes with your doctor. #### **Antibiotic Awareness Week**

Antibiotic Awareness Week begins Nov. 18. This year's theme is "Fighting Antimicrobial Resistance Takes All of Us." Antimicrobial resistance is when germs become stronger than the medicine used to kill them. According to the CDC, Antimicrobial resistance causes 1.27 million deaths globally and nearly 35,000 deaths in the U.S. each year. Learn about actions you can take to prevent infections and fight antimicrobial resistance to keep ourselves, our families, and our communities healthy and safe.
